

Partner Self-Certification for Customer's Portable VCF Licenses

Self-Certification Checklist

OVERVIEW:

Broadcom Partners offering **VMware Cloud Foundation (VCF) based integrated solutions** are able to collaborate with Broadcom on a solution for customers who intend to use their VCF license portability entitlement with that integrated solution. Such an arrangement will enable all customers who procured VCF licenses eligible for License Portability (LP) to migrate to the same, consistent, VCF solution offered by the cloud service provider, and Broadcom will not charge that partner for the fees in which the partner would owe had the customer not used their own licenses. To ensure partners offering integrated VCF solutions are ready technically and operationally, a partner self-certification is required by completing the License Portability Qualification Checklist. This checklist further ensures that providers are running a supported version of VCF as defined in the <u>VMware Cloud Foundation Specific Program Documentation (SPD)</u>. Certification must be done for all partner integrated offerings that will support License Portability, and any new offerings in the future must also go through the self-certification process. For cloud service providers offering <u>only a non-integrated solution (e.g., bare metal-as-a-service)</u>, partners do not need to complete this checklist. 1. Are you an existing partner of Broadcom under the VCSP or MaaS programs?

For cloud service providers offering only a non-integrated solution (e.g., bare metal-as-a-service), all hardware infrastructure used for the new VCF, is recommended to meet the Broadcom hardware certification requirements and be listed on the <u>VMware Compatibility Guide (VCG)</u>.

- 7. Along with integrated offerings, do you also intend to offer non-integrated technology certified Infrastructure only offerings to customers porting VCF? If yes, please note questions 8-12 are not applicable for these offerings.
- 8. Do you understand and would you be willing to participate in customer's proof of purchase verifications per Broadcom policies (for more details request the Partner License Portability Process Guide from your local Broadcom Sales)?
- 9. Do you understand that if you allow the customer to use licenses above the allowed contracted limit for ported entitlements, you may be responsible for any software overage which is expected to be passed on to the customer?
